UNMANNED AIR VEHICLES, MODEL AIRCRAFT, REMOTELY PILOTED AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS, DRONES

The ASN Canada FIA liability insurance policy does not include coverage for the use of Unmanned Air Vehicle (drones), aircraft or hot air balloons.

Therefore, the use of such devices, and all other unmanned aircraft of any description, is prohibited at any event sanctioned by ASN Canada FIA Inc. or ASN Affiliated Territory or Organization, unless:

 Use is by a commercial operator accredited as such under Transport Canada's rules and regulations;

- 2. Use is for videography or photography specific to a named particular event and for no other purpose;
- 3. Use is in strict compliance with all rules and regulations applicable to the operation of unmanned aircraft systems imposed by Transport Canada.
- 4. The operator has provided the organizers of the event with proof of insurance coverage which names as named-insureds: ASN Canada FIA Inc, its applicable affiliated Territory or organization including but not limited to Canadian Association of RallySport, any ASN Canada Territory's affiliated club having any involvement with the event, and such other persons as the circumstances of the event require.
- 5. Such insurance is to provide general liability coverage in an amount of not less than \$5,000,000 which covers not only property damage and personal injury claims, but claims for loss and damage in connection with personal and business personally identifiable and personal health information as well as personal and business non-public personal information.

HOW DOES TRANSPORT CANADA ENFORCE THE REGULATIONS?

Transport Canada regulates the use of all aircraft, manned and unmanned, to keep the public and our airspace safe.

If an incident is reported to the department, one of our inspectors will verify that the operator followed the rules and used the aircraft safely. Local police may also verify if other laws were broken, including the *Criminal Code* and privacy laws.
