The CRC 2018

Perce Neige

The 2018 season started out with a very successful rally that attracted 31 entrants. The overall winner of the event was Karel Carré and Samuel Joyal in their Subaru STI. The 2WD winner was Mathieu Leblanc and Éric Dubé in their Honda.

Rocky Mountain

The 2018 edition of the Rocky Mountain Rally was once again held in mountain town of Invermere and had 32 entries. The overall winner was Antoine L'Estage and Alan Ockwell in the Rocket Rally Subaru STI. The 2WD winner was Wim van der Poel and Bryan Lord in their R2 Ford Fiesta.

Admin Rules

In 2018 the Admin Rules Committee worked on the following items:

Bulletin 2018-02

Clarified the difference between Car 0 and the First Car. Added National Scrutineer responsibilities. Clarified entrant responsibilities.

Bulletin 2018-04

Changed how Judge of Fact reports are handled. Revised some penalties.

Bulletin 2018-05

Changed the championship scoring rules to accommodate an 8 event championship

Technical Rules

In 2018 the Admin Rules Committee worked on the following items:

Bulletin 2017-06

Added requirements for a General Circuit Breaker and changed requirements for Fire Extinguisher mounting

Bulletin 2018-01

Was a complete review of O4WD and P4WD rules adding the requirement for a boost limiting Pop-Off valve for drivers with a Speed Factor >70

This bulletin also separated the P4WD and P2WD rules into separate sections

The Pop-Off valve is scheduled for implementation January 1st 2019. However this will be delayed until May 1st. This allows time for the purchase, installation and testing since setting up the supply ran into a few road-blocks.

Bulletin 2018-03

Rules changed increasing the details associated with log booking requirements. This rule set is in anticipation of a new E-Logbook



Rallye de Charlevoix

In 2018 Rallye de Charlevoix made an official application to join the CRC in 2019.

The board discussed at length the pros & cons of going to an 8 event championship and decided that although a challenge to our operating costs, a media funding, championship scoring and regional distribution fairness, that the benefits of including Charlevoix in the CRC 2019 outweighed the disadvantages.

Charlevoix was granted a place in the 2019 calendar subject to successfully being observed and meeting the CRC requirements resulting from an observation of the 2018 event.

The observation was conducted at the rally in October and a list of required improvements were given to the event. They have since responded and are well on their way to satisfying 100% of the items required.

We are still working on funding for the media. If we fall short it is possible that Charlevoix will not be a full participant in the media program in 2019


We have over 1,500,000 viewers in 2017

 - 4. Develop an electronic log book process 50% functional spec and rule complete
- 2. Administrative Rules Committee (ARC) will meet on a routine basis to research, review and propose administrative rule changes including;
 - I. Clarify the car o time and the actual car o 100%
 - 2. Maintain open dialogue with ARA on rule compatibility 100%
 - 3. Consider rule changes required to accommodate the National Scrutineer 100%
 - 4. Clarify the role of the stewards 100%
 - 5. Review re-fuelling rule, possibly allowing unsupervised re-fuelling. 80%

 - 2. Promote Rally Cross events.
 - 3. Promote Rally Sprint events.
 - 4. In all decisions be mindful of the cost to competitors and organizers
- 4. Help CRC events gain from the promotional assistance provided by CARS;
 - 1. Providing on-stage advertising space to ensure online and TV exposure. 100%
 - 2. Help reduce cost to events by encouraging the leveraging of the media product. 100% RSQ took advantage of leveraged material. Worked closely with Tall Pines
- 5. Develop EV rally car strategy 0%
- 6. Deal with the request from Charlevoix to become a national event. 100%
